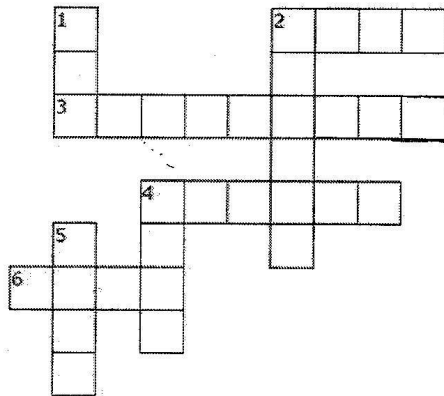


# St. Anthony's Little Church

## CAFOD - ebola in the Congo

On 1 August 2018, the World Health Organisation declared an outbreak of Ebola in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC). The number of people infected with Ebola since last August has passed 2,000, with more than 1,300 deaths, making this outbreak the second worst in history. It took 224 days to reach 1,000 cases, but only 71 days to double to 2,000. "The fact that the DRC outbreak has exceeded 2,000 cases shows the risk of complacency," said John Birchenough, CAFOD spokesman for Africa emergencies. "To some extent, this crisis has crept up on us. It is under-reported because it has not yet reached urban areas, but without a determined and coordinated response, there is a danger that the disease will start to spread rapidly."

## Blessed John Henry Newman is to be canonised

Cardinal Newman is to be canonised on Sunday, 13 October in Rome. It's a very significant event for the Church in our country: Newman will be the first English person since the Reformation martyrs to be declared a saint. John Henry Newman lived 1801-1890. He was baptised in the Church of England, but at the age of 45 he converted to Catholicism. He was gifted with a brilliant intellect and wrote many important works on faith. He established the Oratory at Birmingham, and later in London (Brompton). In 1879 he was created cardinal by Pope Leo XIII, who greatly admired Newman for his considered and unflinching defence of our faith. Newman is also known for his hymns, which include "Praise to the holiest" and "Lead, kindly light". Blessed John Henry's canonisation is an important moment in the life of the English Church.
