CAFOD and Rohingya crisis

It's nearly two years since CAFOD launched its appeal for the Rohingya crisis, since then your support has enabled thousands of refugees, who fled violence in Rakhine region in neighbouring Myanmar to survive. There are now more than 700,000 people who have reached the refugee camps of Cox's Bazar, most of those refugees – mainly women and children – continue to need humanitarian aid for their daily survival. Your generous donation has provided 48,000 families with food - lentils, cooking oil, sugar, and salt. 41,000 families received kitchen supplies and household kits, such as blankets, clothing and sleeping mats. 40,000 families have had their makeshift shelters rebuilt or strengthened against the heavy rains. He was baptised in the Church of England, but at the age of 45 he converted to Catholicism. .
