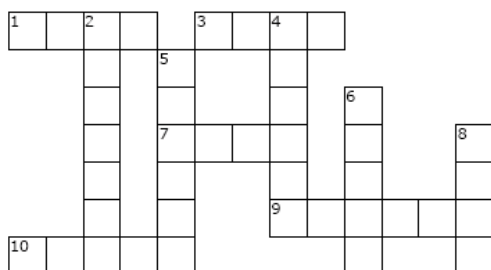


# St. Anthony's Little Church
