Immediately after Jesus' baptism his identity as the Son of God was revealed: 'This is my Beloved Son in whom I am well pleased.' He withdrew to the wilderness where the evil one challenges this reality: 'If you are the Son of God...' We, too, are tempted to doubt our divine identity.
