Paradox

'A paradox is an apparent contradiction. Much of the teaching of Jesus, like today's gospel, has paradox built into it, which is so hard for our minds to sit with. We can't figure it out. But that's the teaching: to awaken us to paradox, to awaken us to mystery and not knowing.' [1]

'By paradox, I mean something that initially looks contradictory or impossible, but in a different frame or at a different level it is in fact deeply true. If we are open, we're led to an inner place of grace where the paradox is simply held by love. We cannot bypass the necessary tension of holding inconsistencies together. Daily ordinary experiences teach us this in a way that is no longer theoretical or abstract. I am talking about just holding the tension, not necessarily finding a resolution or closure to paradox. We must agree to live without resolution, at least for a while. I think this "opening and holding pattern" is the very name and description of faith. Only God, it seems, is spacious enough to include everything.' [2]

"Draw me up an account of your stewardship." "The demand for an accounting often sounds like someone is in trouble. That's how today's parable begins. We would expect the steward to get what he deserves. But the dishonest employee is commended by his boss. Parables rarely give us what we expect. If a parable makes sense we've probably missed the point. The accounting that should have been the steward's ruin became the starting point for a new life, new relationships; it was both an ending and a new beginning, a death and a resurrection. Grace was hiding in the demand for an accounting, waiting to be discovered and claimed.' [3]

'Today's parable speaks to us about forgiveness. It asks us to forgive reality itself for being so broken, a mixture of good and bad. First that paradox has to be overcome inside of us. Then, when we allow God to hold together the opposites within us, it becomes possible for us to do the same for our neighbour and even our enemy.' [2]

I keep trying to understand and to hold it in both hands
How to know what can't be done and still envision all that can.
It's always love that makes it worth it in the end.[4]
