## Gratitude

Whenever we hear Jesus say, "Your faith has saved you," it is important to remember that the original language of the New Testament is Greek and the meaning of the word *sozo* means salvation, true wellness, complete wholeness. The thankful Samaritan shows us that gratitude is essential to our wholeness of mind, body and spirit.

'Practicing gratitude can be a game-changer: it has far reaching effects, from improving our mental health to boosting our relationships with others. Living your life with gratitude helps you notice the little wins—like the bus showing up right on time, a stranger holding the door for you, or the sun shining through your window when you wake up in the morning. Each of these small moments string together to create a web of well-being that, over time, strengthens your ability to notice the good.' [1] Our wellness, our wholeness is intimately related to the giving of thanks.

We can imagine many reasons why the nine lepers didn't give thanks and we could identify with some of them in our own lives: 'pressing matters clamouring for attention; in their delirium of joy some of the lepers may have simply forgotten to return to voice their gratitude; others may have been frightened by their new freedom and the responsibility of fending for themselves instead of relying on alms; some of them may have grown so used to God's favours that they took this gift for granted, feeling they had a right to it.' [2]

Jesus tells the grateful Samaritan, "Your faith has saved you." Last week we reflected on the apostles' request to increase their faith and we saw that a faith-filled life flows from a growing awareness that we already have more than enough because we already have God who is present in every gift we receive. This realisation can only evoke a sense of awe, and 'where there is wonder there is thanksgiving.' [3] We can only guess at the reason for the Samaritan's response but we can sense that for him, and hopefully for us, 'being grateful can be described as feeling the presence of the Divine in our lives.' [4]
