Groundedness

Groundedness refers to “a sense of being fully embodied, whole, centred and balanced in ourselves and our relationships. It is associated with an experience of clarity, wholeness, ‘rightness’ and harmony.” [1] ‘It is having a reference point or a place to come back to when life’s challenges and emotions push us off balance. The centre is the place we know we have to get back to.’ [2]

The theme of today’s Gospel is humility. ‘At the root of *humility* is the Greek word *humus*, earth: the earth that God made and called good, the earth from which, as one of the creation stories goes, God fashioned us. Humility is our fundamental recognition that we each draw our life and breath from the same source, the God who made us and calls us beloved. Humility does not only prevent us from seeing ourselves as more deserving or graced or better than another. It also compels us to recognise that we are no less deserving or graced than another. Humility invites us to stay low to the ground so that we can find the treasures there. Humility helps us remain grounded in the best sense of the word, enabling us to recognise our dependence on the One who fashioned us. It deepens our awareness of our kinship with those who share this earth, this humus. In practising humility, we leave room for the surprising and graced ways that God works—beyond expectation, beyond privilege, beyond status.’ [3]

“Make your home in me as I make mine in you.” (John 15:4) Our daily return to our home base deepens our awareness that we are ‘rooted and grounded in love.’ (Eph 3:17) We recognise that ‘we are all gifted and beautiful, faulted and broken in our own ways and that each of us is loved by the God who created and sustains us.’ [4] ‘To be truly humble and therefore fully human is to be at home both within ourselves and the ground on which we stand. It’s about being truly connected to the reality that lies within us and beyond and to recognise that in our oneness with all life, we play a small and vital role in improving the aspect of creation in which our feet are planted.’ [5] We do this, not in *spite* of our brokenness, but *because* of our brokenness. And we can do it now.
