More than Enough

The prophet Habakkuk is believed to have written his book in the mid-to-late 7th century BC. Habakkuk offers hope by recognising how dark and chaotic the world is and by inviting us to trust in God who tells us that "the upright man will live by his faithfulness." Times have hardly changed since those words were written and it is still true today that we can only fully live by believing that God sustains us in all the circumstances of our lives. 'Faith will not change the circumstances of our lives. Instead, it changes *us* and helps us to face and deal with the difficulties and losses, the joys and successes, the opportunities and possibilities.' [1]

The apostles ask Jesus, "Increase our faith." We often interpret faith in terms of quantity. We think we should have *more* faith. If a little is good a lot must be better. Barbara Brown Taylor writes that we waste a great deal of time and energy "looking for the key to the treasure box of More." All we lack, she argues, "is the willingness to imagine that we already have everything we need." In the second reading St Paul tells us to "to fan into a flame the gift that God gave us." To grow in awareness of what we already have is 'to know that we already have more than we need, because we have God. There is an obscure certainty in our heart of our oneness with God, that God loves us, that God guides us. That's our faith. We learn to live by that faith.' [2]

'Whenever I read the Gospels, I'm struck by how often and how lavishly Jesus commends the faith of those who seek him out. "Your faith has saved you," he tells them. What is it that Jesus admires in these people? As far as I can tell, the only thing they do is turn to him, orient themselves in his direction, *trust* him. What earns his admiration is their willingness — even in difficult, painful, and potentially risky circumstances — to lean into God's goodness, healing, justice, mercy and abundance.'[3] Today we are being asked to go forth and live in the realisation that because we are in God we already have more than we need. We are being asked to live in the light of what we already see, sense, hear, and know. To live a faith-filled life is to live a life of service and duty motivated and sustained by love.
