## *Location...Location...Location*

The weeks of Advent could be likened to our experience of searching for our forever home which we hope to find in the perfect location. In our scrutiny of countless estate agents' advertisements, we won't find Jesus' words, "Make your home in me as I make mine in you." If we invest all that we can in making our home in God, then we will always be 'at home' no matter where we physically live, even if the location is in the wilderness of homelessness, of war or the wilderness of those times when 'our usual ways of being and our ordinary coping mechanisms are stripped away. These times can leave us feeling vulnerable and thin-skinned, easily tipping over into sorrow, anxiety and despair and sometimes even feeling truly destabilised. But our wilderness times can be opportunities for us to venture into a deeper way of being in relationship with ourselves and with God.' [1] 'There's something about the wilderness. It's the place where our lives can be transformed, the place we are most open to changing and being changed. Hidden within every wilderness is the beauty of divine presence.' [2]

In our search for our forever home we travel many winding roads, both physically and mentally until we find the way that leads to the home of our dreams. And in our search to make our home in God, how do we know which is the way? 'Travel the most ancient way of all: the path that leads you to the centre of your life. This journey is not about miles. It is not about how far you can walk or how fast. It is about what you will do with this moment. The treasure in our map is buried not at journey's end but at its beginning.' [3]

'The real spiritual path is wherever you are. God is everywhere. The spiritual journey is **a growth in awareness** that what you are seeking is where you are.' [4]

'Catherine of Siena once wrote, 'All the way to heaven *is* heaven.' Perhaps this roadmap is enough to keep us walking, reminding us that the wind we feel on the back of our necks is nothing less than the breath of God.' [5]
