Joy

The third Sunday of Advent is traditionally called "Gaudete" or "Rejoice" Sunday. Although the first reading sets a tone of joyful hope, in the gospel 'joy is not evident behind the bars that hold the fiery John the Baptist.' [1] 'The wilderness expanse has given way to the confines of a prison cell. The prophet with a voice is now a prisoner with a question: "Are you the one who is to come or is it someone else?" [2] 'If John's doubt, pain, and untimely death don't shake our faith even a little bit, then perhaps we need to ask why. It has always seemed odd to me that we who worship the Crucified One have a hard time staying in the presence of extreme doubt, despair, and suffering. Somehow we feel a need to blunt the edges, to soften the blows, to make everything okay. But this story is not "okay," and many of our own stories aren't okay either. The prison bars that hold us don't always give way; our doubts don't always resolve themselves; justice doesn't always arrive in time; questions don't always receive the answers we hunger for.

Many of the pious responses I've experienced are not enough for the world I actually live in. They're too lukewarm, too clean and too polite. They move to closure and triumph so quickly that they turn pain into an abstraction. They dull my capacity to practice genuine compassion, empathy, and long-suffering. What is the response that will equip us to sit gently and patiently in the darkness with those who mourn, fear, rage or doubt? Today, perhaps we are being invited to honour doubt, despair, and silence as reasonable reactions to a broken world; to create sacred space for grief, to mourn freely; to rage against injustice; to let joy be joy, sorrow be sorrow, horror be horror; to feel deeply, because God does.

It may surprise us to learn that John the Baptist is known as a patron saint of spiritual joy. Joy in a prison cell isn't about sentimentality, or about the pious suppression of our most painful crises and questions.' [1] 'John's question may be one of doubt, despair, disillusionment or disappointment. But is not a lack of belief. It is a lack of recognition. Instead of giving John a yes or no answer, Jesus lovingly describes what to look for, how to recognise the kingdom.' [2] 'The 'Kingdom' is really a metaphor for a *state of consciousness*. It is a transformed awareness of the oneness Jesus has in mind when he says: "I am in God; God is in you; you are in God; we are in each other." This mutual inter-abiding expresses the indivisible reality of divine love.' [3] When we see this divine love in action in the healing of the sick, both in mind and body, we are offered the choice to have faith in that love 'which totally permeates all conditions, including devastation, trauma and tragedy. If we respond with faith grounded in a peace that's not dependent on the outcome of the effort, we will then experience deep joy. [4]
