## Longing

When we reflect on the Beatitudes we are struck by the leitmotif or the recurring theme of longing, 'a yearning for a fulfilment that somehow lies beyond us. It flows from our deeply rooted human incompleteness. We all long for something more – for others as well as ourselves.' [1] Our effort to live the Beatitudes is our attempt 'to make sense of that intense and disturbing imperative for a completeness that always eludes us.' [2] Jesus sees our sincere attempts and says to us, "Blessed are you."

Archbishop Em Elias Chacour writes: '*Blessed* is the translation of the word *makarioi*, used in the Greek New Testament. However, when I look further back to Jesus' Aramaic, I find that the original word was *ashray* which means to set yourself on the right way for the right goal.' 'Jesus is not talking about doing virtuous deeds so we'll be rewarded later. He is talking about making transformational choices so that we will experience eternal life now. As we enter the path of transformation, the most valuable thing we have working in our favour is our yearning. When we yearn, we come into sympathetic vibration with a deeper heart-knowing. The heart is an organ of alignment; it connects us. Yearning is the vibration of that connectedness.' [3]

*Blessed are the pure in heart: they shall see God.* 'Jesus ties together heart and sight. When the heart is right, Jesus says, seeing will be right. The heart in the ancient sacred traditions has a very specific and perhaps surprising meaning. It is not the seat of our personal emotions but it is an organ for the perception of divine purpose and beauty. It is our antenna, so to speak, given to us to orient us toward the divine radiance and to synchronise our being with its more subtle movements. The heart is not for personal expression but for divine perception.' [3] When the distorted instrument of the mind is made clear, we see the divine spark at the centre of our very being; and we see simultaneously that spark in the heart of every other human being, one and the same in all.' [4] We live the Beatitudes in response to our growing awareness of who we are in God.
