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- A planned online safety curriculum for all year groups matched against a nationally agreed framework e.g. Education for a Connected World Framework by UKIS/DCMS and regularly taught in a variety of contexts.
- Lessons are matched to need; are age-related and build on prior learning.
- Lessons are context-relevant with agreed objectives leading to clear and evidenced outcomes
- Learner need and progress are addressed through effective planning and assessment
- It incorporates/makes use of relevant national initiatives and opportunities e.g. Safer Internet Day and Anti-bullying week
- The programme will be accessible to learners at different ages and abilities such as those with additional learning needs or those with English as an additional language.
- The online safety education programme should be relevant and up to date to ensure the quality of learning and outcomes.
