She Left her Jar Behind

"We all go down to some well. We could each name the wells from which we drink: the well of perfectionism; the well of power and control; the well of hiding and isolation. Too many will drink from the wells of addiction. Many will draw from the well of busyness and denial. Day after day, month after month, year after year we go to the same well hoping our thirst will be quenched. We leave as thirsty as when we arrived only to return the next day. For too long we have drunk from the well that can never satisfy.' [1]

'The work of mature religion is to lead us beyond what we think we *want* to what we really *need*. The woman in today's gospel has come to the well because she wants water. Jesus tries to lead her, step by step, beyond what she thinks she wants and to help her see that water is just the symbol of what she really needs.' [2] 'Her thirst will never be quenched by the external wells of life. Nor will ours. Jesus told her "Whoever drinks this water will get thirsty again - but anyone who drinks the water that I shall give will never be thirsty again: the water that I shall give will turn into a spring inside, welling up to eternal life." This is the well from which new life and new possibilities spring forth. It is the well that frees us from the patterns and habits that keep us living as thirsty people. This living water is Jesus' own life. It became in the Samaritan woman "a spring of water gushing up to eternal life." She discovered within herself the interior well and left her water jar behind. She had now become the well in which Christ's life flows.' [1]

She left her jar behind, that water-bearing vessel on which she depended for her very life. She abandoned it at the well. *She* had become the vessel. Filled with the living water that she found in the midst of her repetitive daily task, the woman goes to spill forth what she has found. The Samaritan woman allowed God to use her despite her background, gender, ethnicity, what people thought of her and how people looked at her. She became a vessel of living, liberating, life-giving water. [3] The 'fountain within us bubbling up unto eternal life', is the awareness that from the very beginning we are God's beloved. If we only knew what God has already given us. [2]
