Live Into the Images

"Deep spiritual transformation happens primarily in the presence of images. They touch the unconscious. They move you to a new place. And so it is that in our Gospel passage today Jesus uses powerful, transformative images, telling us, "You are the salt of the earth," and "You are the light of the world." And then he leaves it at that. He doesn't explain to us what it means; he doesn't give us instructions. He leaves us to live into the images." [1]

Our images associated with light's life-giving attributes would probably be similar to the images conjured up by the people listening to Jesus. Light was as precious to them as it is to us. And salt? It's easy for us to miss the significance of this in our modern world where salt is cheap and plentiful. How were Jesus' followers moved when they became more aware of the transforming qualities of this priceless daily commodity in their lives? What links did they make to the ways in which they could be agents in bringing out the best in their own lives and in the lives of those around them? What links do we make?

- 'Salt enhances the flavour of food. It only produces its effect when it is totally merged with the food. It is indistinguishable from the rest of the food but its presence or absence is very obvious.' [2]
- 'Salt is meant to enhance, not dominate.
- Salt does its best work when it's poured out, when it's scattered, when it dissolves into what is around it. It's meant to give of itself. It's meant to share its unique flavour in order to bring out the best in all that surrounds it.
- Salt is used for medicinal purposes. It cleanses and purifies.
- Salt is used as a preservative.
- Salt is precious.' [3]

And Jesus said, "You are the salt of the earth."

'Jesus knowingly named a commodity that was priceless in his time and place. He conferred great value on those who did not consider themselves valuable. He is still doing this. For us. Now.' [3]
