Love is Who We Are

'In today's gospel Jesus tells his apostles that he is leaving and yet coming. To us, leaving and coming sound like opposites and if we are not careful we will get stuck trying to reconcile or figure this out. It is not, however, something to figure out. It is rather a means to see and live in a different way. Leaving and coming. Absence and Presence. These must be held in tension, not as mutually exclusive. This paradox confronts us with the question of whether Jesus, for us, is a past memory or a present reality, a sentimental story that makes us feel good or a living experience that challenges, guides, and nurtures our lives.' [1]

In her song 'Love Always' Carrie Newcomer sings: It takes some starts and stops to hold a paradox. In our relationship with God that 'starting and stopping' involves a willingness to be open to a constant dislodging of our perceptions, especially our perception of love. It involves a growing awareness that 'our actions do not earn us God's love: they reveal our love for God, a love that originates in the eternal, unconditional loving presence of God within us.' [1] In our relationship with God that 'starting and stopping' involves being at the correct starting point. We are familiar with the story of the traveller who stopped to ask someone the directions to his destination. "If I were you, I wouldn't start from here," was the reply. Jesus' starting point was his awareness that 'I am in the Father and the Father is in me.' (John 14:11) The Spirit of Truth abiding in us will help us grow in awareness of our abiding in God who is Love.

'Love is who we are. When we get the 'who' right and experience the reality that we are created in the image of God who is love, then we will do what we are created to do: to Love God and love all that God has created.' [2] We will keep his commandments. "If you love me, you will (want to) keep my commandments."

On Thursday we will celebrate the feast of the Ascension when Jesus reassures us that he is with us always. 'Jesus' ascension is not about his absence but about his presence. It is not about a location but about a relationship.' [1] In Acts 1:9 we are told that the apostles saw a cloud receive him out of their sight. In the bible a cloud often depicts the abiding presence of God. 'We are always in the presence of God, what is absent is our awareness.' [2)
