Thankfulness

"I am the living bread." 'I AM' is God's own name, which Jesus applies to himself. When he says that he is the Bread of Life, we should note that he is not talking primarily here of the Eucharist, of Holy Communion. Rather, Jesus is saying that he, his whole way of life, his teaching, his attitudes and relationships towards his Father and people, everything that the Gospel tells us about him is real nourishment and food for our daily living. Not to know and assimilate Jesus in this way is to be starved of essential nourishment for living a full life. We eat that bread by absorbing into ourselves the spirit, the truth and integrity, the love and compassion, the generosity and the peacefulness of Jesus. We will then be fully alive – now and forever. [1]

In the Jewish Scriptures bread is often a symbol of the Word of God. Jesus invites us come to him and to feed on his presence, to feed on his word. That word will shape our lives. [2] 'God speaks to us through everything there is. Every person, every situation, everything in creation is ultimately God's Word telling us something and challenging us to respond. Everything is a gift. If it is a gift then the appropriate response is thanksgiving.' [3]

When we speak of the Mass, we often use the word Eucharist which comes from the Greek word which means thanksgiving. When we come together to celebrate the Eucharist, we come to 'feed on the gift of God's word speaking to us through everything there is. We come to deepen our awareness of the gift of God's presence in everyone and everything. The degree to which we are awake to this truth is a measure of our gratefulness, and gratefulness is a measure of our aliveness. It is not happiness that makes us grateful. It is gratefulness that makes us happy. There will be times when we will be challenged to respond fully and gratefully to something we cannot enjoy. Our grateful response will depend on whether or not we have learned to unwrap the gift-within-the-gift: the opportunity to grow. To give thanks, even when we cannot see the goodness of the giver is to find the path to peace of heart.' [3]

When we celebrate Mass – and life – in a spirit of thankfulness for the presence of God's word in every aspect of our lives we will, with St Paul, deepen our awareness of our oneness with each other, 'because we all have a share in this one bread,' the Word of God.
