The Shaping of Community

The Kingdom of heaven is a central theme running all the way through the Gospel of Matthew. 'It is the only gospel which has the word "church" in it and it is considered to be the "Church's Gospel" because of the passage which speaks of Peter's faith as the "Rock" on which the Church will be built (16:18) and also the reference to the church community in 28:19.' [1]

'It has been well said that the test of a story is the sort of person it shapes, and ultimately the sort of community it forms. Matthew's gospel story is an identity-forming, lifestyle-shaping narrative calling for a discipleship deeply rooted in a way of life envisioned by Jesus' teaching. Jesus' story disturbs the status quo, creates new priorities and identities, gives new purpose, commissions people to new tasks, and creates an alternative ecclesial expression that looks more like a movement than an institution. It shatters our tendency to focus solely on the temple or stained glass sanctuary and it takes holiness onto the road, redeeming the ordinary, reclaiming and proclaiming all of creation as the kingdom of heaven.' [2]

In today's gospel, Jesus gives us an example of how we can 'take holiness on the road.' When he saw how the crowds of people were lost and dejected he was moved with compassion. 'The original Greek word used is the strongest word for pity in the Greek language. It describes the compassion which moves us to the deepest depths of our being.' [3] 'When we choose to be compassionate, we are yielding to the compassionate nature of God flowing through us. Compassion is the love that recognises and goes forth to identify with the preciousness of all that is lost and dejected within ourselves and others. Compassionate action means working with ourselves as much as working with others.' [4]

Jesus limits the apostles' outreach to the lost sheep of Israel. 'He is not excluding the Gentiles or the Samaritans from the all-encompassing compassionate love of God. But since the labourers are few they can only concentrate on one specific area at a time.' [3] We can all be labourers of compassionate action wherever we find ourselves. Our prayer is that we deepen our awareness that 'compassion does not originate in us. It begins with God.' [5] It is a gift freely given to us for us to freely share.
