How Do We Live?

'Our image of God creates us. This is why it is so important that we see God as loving and benevolent.' [1] Part of today's gospel helps us see God in this way, but we become uncertain and afraid when we fearfully interpret the image of the Son of Man separating people one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. Our fears are increased when we read about eternal punishment.

To release our hold on these fears, it might help to consider the following:


a. 'Matthew often ends his stories with a threat and all we do is to remember the threat. Matthew's way of teaching is to motivate us by using threatening language. But this is not a definition of God. God who is love, has created us in love to be love and therefore to be like God.' [1] b. 'In Palestine at that time the sheep and the goats were herded together during the day. At night the goats had to be put into shelter because they coped poorly with the cold. The sheep preferred the open air. Some species of sheep and goats looked rather alike, so care was needed in making the separation. The caring shepherd is a person of compassion.'[2]

c. The word in the Hebrew Bible that we sometimes translate into English as "eternity" is olam. In some contexts, olam just means "a very long time." [3] 'Yes our actions have eternal significance. It matters what we do. It matters whether we live a life of love or a life of selfishness."[1] It may take us a very long time to choose to live a life of love. The longer we take to make that choice, the more we punish ourselves.

With the above insights, we allow our negative thoughts to slide away and we free space within us to be open to Jesus' teaching on what it means to live in love. 'In the examples he gives of compassionate caring for the hungry, the stranger, the poor, those in prison of any nature, Jesus focuses on how we live and not just what we believe in our heads. He is also saying that we are going to find the Christ in those that we came to give Christ to. He doesn't say, "It's like..." He says, "What you do to people, you do to me." We are the same. This is the body of Christ.[1]
