Responding to God's Message

The word Pharisee means separated. The observance of the Pharisees was so strict and rigorous that they separated themselves from the rest of the people. From this comes the expression "pharisaic mentality". It is typical of people who think they can attain justice through the rigid and rigorous observance of the law. Generally, they are people who are afraid, who do not have the courage to assume the risk of liberty and of responsibility. They hide themselves behind the law and authority. When these people obtain an important function, they become harsh and insensitive and indifferent in order to hide their own imperfection.[1]

If we are to appreciate the conflict that is evident in today's gospel passage, we must understand that Jesus was basing his teachings on the same laws and traditions available to the Pharisees. The differences between their teachings are often highlighted and amplified by Matthew whose church is thought to have included many Jewish Christians who may not have believed that a break with the synagogue was necessary to be a follower of Jesus. Jesus tells the crowd that it is correct to do and observe what the scribes and Pharisees teach; it is their example that is to be avoided, namely, their love of being honoured and exalted. [2]

In today's second reading, St Paul speaks about how the Thessalonians accepted God's message. Their response epitomises the essence of today's gospel: "As soon as you heard the message that we brought you as God's message, you accepted it for what it really is, God's message and not some human thinking; and it is still a living power among you who believe it."

This response requires humility, a word which has its roots in the Greek word humus. Humility helps us remain grounded in the best sense of the word, enabling us to recognise our dependence on the One who fashioned us. It deepens our awareness of our kinship with those who share this earth, preventing us from seeing ourselves as more deserving or graced or better than another. In practising humility, we leave room for the surprising and graced ways that God works—beyond expectation, beyond privilege, beyond status.' [3]
