A Wider Vision

'We all live with certain categories that make sense to us. We use them to try to make sense of people, circumstances, life, relationships and our understanding of God. Categories by their nature involve definitions, limitations and expectations. There's nothing wrong with that until those categories begin to close us off, narrow our vision and impoverish our life. At some point they always do. We've probably all experienced times when we've thought or said something like "I'm just not sure what to make of this," "I can't figure him/her out." In those times our categories aren't working. The person or situation doesn't fit within our boxes and definitions.

John is one of those people. The wilderness is one of those situations. They are outside the usual categories of the religious authorities of Jesus' day. The priests and Levites are sent to get some answers. When they come to the wilderness and to John with their categories, expectations, definitions and limits, they expect John to fit. He doesn't. He won't allow that. With each negation John refuses to let himself be boxed in or categorised. The priests and the Levites just don't get it. Their categories have kept them from seeing and knowing the one who already stands among them.

Sometimes our categories do that to us. They keep us from recognising the one who stands among us. What if we let the failure of our categories expand our vision? When people, situations, or even God no longer fit the definitions and expectations of our categories maybe it's time to look again, to open ourselves and to consider that there might be something more in the person in front of us and in the situation we are experiencing.' [1] Then we will experience the joy which St Paul speaks of: "Be happy at all times; pray constantly; and for all things give thanks to God." 'This joy proceeds from our surrendering to the Love inside us, a Love that is bigger than we are and by choosing to stay in Love we will pray always.' [2] Love knows no categories; love expands our vision and 'when we recognise the love of God in everything, we will be truly grateful.' [3]
