## Endings and New Beginnings

Today the cycle of liturgical feasts, fasts, and gospel readings begins anew. In Mark 13:31 Jesus says, "Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away. And today, in verse 33 we are told that we do not know when that time will come. It sounds like the end of the world, the grand finale. What if that's not what this gospel is about? Maybe today's gospel is about an ending and not the end. Maybe there's more to our lives and our world than a single static beginning point and a single static ending point separated and defined by time. Maybe beginnings and endings are two sides or two perspectives of the same event, recognisable moments of growth and transformation in Christ, deepenings of our interior life. It's not time that separates and defines our beginnings and endings. It is, rather, that Christ joins and unites them. So every beginning finds its fullness in an ending and every ending is the context for a new beginning. And all that happens in Christ, the one who called himself the alpha and the omega, the beginning and the end.

Sometimes we need to wake up and face the necessary endings in our lives. Each of us comes to this day with all sorts of stories and experiences which have defined us, shaped who we are, given meaning and direction to our lives, and have been the motives and drivers for what we do, how we think and the ways we relate. They are powerful stories that give structure to our lives. They are central to our lives and identity. They are the stories that shape our view of the world, ourselves, others and God. Some stories have been foundational for us but no longer give us a safe or life-giving place to stand. Today we are asked to be alert, to be aware of those stories which have defined and determined our life in such a way that they have denied us the life we really want, have narrowed our view of God, the world, others and ourselves. All the readings today offer us an assurance that it is safe to name these stories and let them go and when we do so we will experience that this is not the end but the context for a new beginning.
