Transfiguration

Transfiguration means a change of form, a metamorphosis. Yet, 'Jesus did not become what he was not already, but appeared to the disciples as he always was, opening their eyes, giving sight to those who were blind.' [1] 'Peter, John and James saw for the first time what has always been. They saw the light of divinity fully manifest in a human being.' [2] We all have our mountaintop experiences, those 'Aah' moments when we sense a oneness with the Divine – in the first snowdrops of Spring, in the face of the beloved, in the awesome sunrise. 'These are timeless moments because they touch eternity.' [3]

Like Peter, we may want to build our home on our 'mountain peak', we may want to make our fleeting experience permanent. But 'humanity can never build a dwelling place for God. It is, rather, God who makes humanity the dwelling place of divinity. This is most profoundly revealed in the Transfiguration of Jesus. [2] Jan Richardson beautifully describes how we might feel:

'Believe me, I know how tempting it is to remain inside this blessing,

to linger where everything is dazzling and clear. We could stay.

But this blessing is built for leaving.

This blessing is made for coming down the mountain.

This blessing wants to travel with you as you return to level ground.'

We mustn't be reluctant or afraid to come down from the mountain. 'Each day is just as God-infused as the experiences that occur on our mountaintops. That moment of transfiguration now resides eternally within us, helping us to see and hear the sacred both in our mountaintop and our valley experiences. Can we hold the mountain and the valley as one — denying neither and embracing both?' [4]
