Choosing Life and Death

From Palm Sunday until Easter Sunday we immerse ourselves in what we call the Paschal Mystery which includes the suffering, death and resurrection of Jesus. Although it is for liturgical and catechetical reasons, spread over a week, it should be seen as an indivisible single experience. [1]

Palm Sunday: In some ways today feels like one of confusion and contradiction. What began as a victory parade ends as a funeral procession. There's a part of us that wants to say, "Well which is it? Palms or passion?" The answer is, "Yes." It is both, palms and passion. That's the reality of our lives. It is not about choosing between life **or** death, palms **or** passion; but about choosing life **and** death, palms **and** passion. [2]

Holy Thursday: In John's full account of the Last Supper, Jesus will speak the word *love* thirty-one times. The love that Jesus enacts and speaks this night is an extraordinary gift reserved not for the disciples - or us - alone. "Do as I have done to you." How will we enact this love, giving it flesh for the life of the world? [3]

Good Friday: Today the liturgy invites us to surrender to the mystery of the cross which teaches us that the price we pay for holding together the contradictions within ourselves, others and the world is always some form of crucifixion. When we kneel at the foot of the cross Jesus teaches us how to stand against hate without becoming hate, how to oppose evil without becoming evil. [4]

Holy Saturday: This is the day between dying and rising. This day calls us to hold our anguish and our hope in the same hand. It invites us to marvel that when our hearts have been shattered, they somehow manage to keep beating. We somehow manage to keep breathing. Do not despair. You hold the memory of what it was to be whole. It lives deep in your bones. It abides in your heart that has been torn and mended a hundred times. It persists in your lungs that know the mystery of what it means to be full, to be empty, to be full again. I am not asking you to give up your grip on the shards you clasp so close to you, but to wonder what it would be like for those jagged edges to meet each other in some new pattern that you have never imagined, that you have never dared to dream.
