True Leadership


'In biblical times there were two kinds of shepherds - the **hired hand** for whom keeping the sheep was just a job, moving from one flock to another depending on the job, but he wouldn't risk his life for the sheep. Then there was the **shepherd-owner** of the flock who grew up with the flock and stayed with its all his life. He knew each sheep individually and called each one by name. The sheep were kept in an enclosed space with only an opening for the sheep to go in and out. At night the shepherd would usually lay down across the opening so that the sheep would not wander out and wolves would not get in.' [1]

By calling himself the Good Shepherd, Jesus shows the kind of leadership that should exist in the community of his followers. We are all called to shepherd each other. "Our calling as shepherds is not to introduce something new, but to reveal, purify and intensify what is already there. Every shepherd is called to be a Sacrament of the mystical, a reminder for others of their divine loveliness." [2]

The world is in need of true leadership. 'Genuine leaders recognise the sacredness of the human presence. Leadership is not about function or bureaucracy. It is about awakening and empowering human presence.'[3] John O' Donohue offers us a prayer for leaders:

May the gift of leadership awaken in you as a vocation, Keep you mindful of the providence that calls you to serve.... May you have the wisdom to read time clearly And know when the seed of change will flourish. In your heart may there be a sanctuary For the stillness where clarity is born. May your work be infused with passion and creativity And have the wisdom to balance compassion and challenge. May you never put yourself at the centre of things. May you act not from arrogance but out of service. May your power never become a shell Wherein your heart would silently atrophy. May you welcome your own vulnerability As the ground where healing and truth join. May integrity of soul be your first ideal, The source that will quide and bless your work.
