When our ‘faith is more *how* to believe than *what* to believe,’ [1] we will experience ‘a deep inner peace which is not threatened by the circumstances of our lives. Ours will be the deep peace of God which is beyond all our conditions for peace.’ [2] When we face our chaos rather than turn away from it, we make way for the wholeness we crave. It brings release to what has been bound; it invites and enables and calls us to move with the freedom for which God made us.’ [3]
