Experiencing The Christ

'The three Synoptic Gospels – Matthew, Mark and Luke - largely talk about Jesus, the historical figure who healed and taught and lived in human history. Peter's response, "You are the Christ," came from his experience of the historical Jesus and his understanding of the Christ as being the 'anointed one' or Messiah, the long-awaited liberator of Israel. The prologue to John's Gospel (John 1:1-11) is not talking about Jesus; it's talking about the Christ. John experienced the Christ as the Word who was with God, the Word who was God, the Word who became flesh, the Word through whom all that came to be had life in him. Christ is not Jesus' last name. The entire sweep of the meaning of the Anointed One, the Christ, includes us and includes all of creation since the beginning of time.

St Paul never met the historical Jesus. He experienced the Risen Christ and his experience is much closer to what our own could be. When we believe in Jesus Christ, we are believing in something much bigger than the historical incarnation that we call Jesus. In Jesus the Timeless Christ became time bound. Today we are being invited to leave aside our attempts to understand Christ and allow ourselves to experience Christ. We can do this by setting aside some quiet time and reflecting on some – or one – of the following:

We live in a Christ-soaked world. This entire world is soaked through and through with Christ, with divinity.

Christ is God and Jesus is the Christ's historical manifestation in time.

All creatures must in some way carry the divine DNA of their Creator.

The entire physical world around us is both the hiding place and the revelation place for God.

If we experience our quiet time as a time of surrender, entering the present moment fully and without resistance, we will experience that our surrender is almost the exact opposite of giving up. In fact, it allows us to be given to!

Bishop's Certificate in Catechesis

The Bishop's Certificate in Catechesis is an online course and is available for all those, both in and outside the diocese, who proclaim their faith to others: as evangelisers, catechists or adult formators. It is a course for all wishing to know their Catholic faith more deeply no matter their stage in life. You will take a journey through the Church's teaching to understand your own faith in a more profound way and be able to share your faith with confidence and joy.

This is a systematic course with study over 24 months. You will be expected to attend 3 in-person Saturday sessions and 8 online study sessions throughout the course. All the units are accessed from a secured online platform. The books required are the Bible and the Catechism of the Catholic Church.

Activities engage you with the material in a variety of ways as you progress. Short written tasks (between 300-500 words) help you to sum up the key points and enable you to become more confident in expressing your faith.
