Meeting and Presenting

'The Feast of the Presentation is sometimes called the Feast of Meeting. Mary, called Theotokos in Greek, which means God-bearer or God-birther, would place her son in the hands of the old man Simeon. In that presentation and in that holding, Simeon would be Theodochos, the God receiver. He had been promised that he would see the Messiah, the Christ, the one whose name means salvation, and that promise was made many years before it was fulfilled. Simeon must have lived those days, years and decades with hope, trust and a deep longing.

Who among us has not had his or her life characterised by waiting, longing and anticipation? We all know what it's like to wait – waiting for life to change, for the grief to go away, for a prayer to be answered, for joy to return, for forgiveness and reconciliation, for clarity about a decision, for meaning and purpose, for healing and new life. We wait and hope for all sorts of things.' [1] 'Waiting is the passionate and contemplative crucible in which new life and spiritual wholeness can be birthed.' [2]

'During his many years of waiting, Simeon continued to show up. He continued to be vigilant and attentive. He continued to trust the promise. He continued to wait with hope and expectation. Sometimes showing up is the most difficult work we do and it takes all we have to just show up.' [1] That 'showing up' is our daily meeting with God in whatever way brings us to 'the temple', when we may be presented with experiences of meeting with a presence greater than ourselves, experiences of Christ's presence in ourselves, in others and in creation. Like Simeon, each one of us is a 'God receiver.'

'Holding the child Jesus in his arms, Simeon offers praise for the 'light for revelation to the Gentiles. Taking a cue from Simeon, some churches began to mark this day with a celebration of light: the Candle Mass, during which priests would bless the candles to be used in the year to come. Coinciding with the turn toward spring and lengthening of light in the Northern Hemisphere, Candlemas offers a liturgical celebration of the renewing of light and life that comes to us in the natural world at this time of year. As we emerge from the deep of winter, the feast reminds us of the perpetual presence of Christ our Light in every season.[4]
